# Attendance Zone Process

In 2005, the MISD School Board approved a process for school attendance zoning.

The process approved was as follows:

- Board establishes zoning considerations (guidelines)
- Demographer develops zoning options
- Administration reviews options for feasibility over time
- Attendance Zone Review Committee established

## Attendance Zone Process (Continued)

- Public comment on all options
- Attendance Zone Review Committee analyzes all options, presents pros/cons of each option
- Executive Council reviews Attendance Zone Review Committee products
- Superintendent recommends new attendance zones to School Board
- School Board approves new attendance zones

# Attendance Zone Priorities

In 2011, the MISD School Board determined priorities for school attendance zoning.

**They determined the zoning task to be:**

1. Identify geographic areas to be served by each campus;
2. Relieve current and/or projected overcrowding; and
3. Contribute to stability over time.

# Attendance Zone Considerations

The following priorities are considered when establishing new attendance zones.

## **Elementary School Considerations**

- Neighborhoods

- Current and future growth patterns

- Projected future elementary school sites

- Natural and man-made barriers

- Other issues such as transportation and special programs

# The Facts

- Short-term growth is projected largely east of SH 360.
- The re-zoning that went into effect in 2013-14 for Cabaniss, Daulton, and Spencer resulted in better distribution of the current and future student population among these three schools.
- The threshold level determined by the district for schools will impact future decisions.
- Under the Moderate Growth Scenario, the elementary student population is projected to increase by 13% or 1,675 students Districtwide in the next ten years. (Fall, 2025)

# Judy K. Miller Facility Background

- The facility was built as part of the 2006 Bond program.
- The facility housed J. L. Boren Elementary from Summer 2013 to December 2014.
- The facility is currently housing Glen Harmon Elementary from December 2014 to Summer 2016.
- The facility opened to a limited Judy K. Miller enrollment in 2015-2016.
- The facility will house Charlotte Anderson Elementary from Summer 2016 to July 2017.
- Judy K. Miller Elementary will open as a stand-alone campus in August 2017.

# District Recommendation

- Form a district-wide committee to address the projected growth east of SH 360 for elementary schools by establishing a 2017-2018 attendance zone for Judy K. Miller.
- Address the capacity level of schools based on projected enrollment.

# Attendance Zone Review Committee

## **Terms for serving on the Attendance Zone Review Committee:**

- Only one person per household will be eligible to serve on the committee.
- The committee will be comprised of up to 26 members. Five alternates will also be selected in the event that one of the members is unable to serve.
- Attendance Zone Review Committee members must attend BOTH meetings on March 8 and April 7.
